More than 106,000 Americans have died from a drug overdose in the past 12 months, according to estimates from Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Use of street drugs that include fentanyl has been a major factor in the surge in overdose deaths in recent years.

Facts to Know about Fentanyl

- Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid pain reliever that is up to 50 times stronger than heroin.
- Using a more powerful opioid can increase the likelihood of overdosing.
- Street drugs like heroin, cocaine and methamphetamine often include fentanyl to increase effects.
- Secause you can't see, taste or smell fentanyl, people may be unaware they are using it.
- Test strips are available to identify if fentanyl is present in a drug.
- Naloxone is a medicine that can reverse an opioid overdose.
